

Dear Parents,

I want to welcome you back as we march forward into this unprecedented 2020-2021 school year at Immaculate Conception Grade School! For those of you who are new to Immaculate Conception or those I have not met, I am Karen Proctor the social worker at Immaculate Conception - this is my 16th year at IC. I am here on Mondays and Thursdays. AMITA/Alexian Brothers employs me, in partnership with Catholic Schools in the area to provide support services. My credentials include a Masters in Social Work; I am a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and have 25+ years in the field of social work. I am the mother of three children (27,23,21) 1 in graduate school and 1 in undergraduate.

I have outlined some of my responsibilities, so you will know what a social worker can do in the school setting.

Crisis Intervention: bereavement, self-injury or harm to self.

Brief counseling: loss, behaviors, divorce, death, peer relations, anxiety, stress. Students maybe referred to outside counseling as needed.

Classroom interventions: work with classroom teacher and develop programs such as getting along with peers, social skills and current issues.

Consultation: is available for teachers and parents to ask questions regarding any social/emotional/behavioral observations in students.

Virtual Counseling Services:

Provide Individual sessions (Via Google/Zoom)

Conduct student assessments and refer as needed

Consult with teachers and families (Virtually or by phone)

Conduct weekly check-ins with students > identified by school as students of concern (COVID related hardship, isolation anxiety, school refusal)
