It has been my great pleasure and honor to serve with my fellow board members on the ICGS School Board...

...My three years on the board have given me a great insight into the dedication and commitment of our ICGS administration, faculty, staff, parents, and coaches. The wonderful relationships between all these individuals makes ICGS a wonderful community. With the onset of the global pandemic, these last months have especially highlighted for me the reasons we send our children to ICGS. From the immediate and seamless start of e-learning to Zoom scavenger hunts to school car parades,

my appreciation and pride in our school and sense of family has deepened.

I would like to share some of the key areas with which the School Board, in partnership with ICGS administration, has been involved this year:

- ∼ With funds from the 2018 2019 Annual Appeal a new Pre-K 3 space was renovated to accommodate a 5-day / week morning program and a new west side entrance was installed to enhance the safety of drop off in the Pre-K 4 room.
- ✓ Initiated the steps to begin redesigning our school website for the 2021–2022 school year. With the unexpected technological needs brought on by the pandemic, our initial goal of a 2020–2021 deadline required adjustment and will provide additional time for a smooth reboot.
- Worked with ICGS Parents' Club to design sponsorship and marketing

- strategies to better serve our community / businesses, restructure roles to meet evolving strategies, transition Kindergarten welcome sign initiative to Newcomers / Welcoming committee, and improve intergroup communications regarding budgetary needs of the school.
- Attended Diocese of Joliet Catholic Schools Office meetings, parish Finance and Faith Formation Committee meetings, and ICGS Parents' Club meetings
- Supported the Development Office in marketing strategies / enrollment recruitment and facilitated a new wine & cheese format
- Marketed the "Empower Illinois" tuition tax credit program to parents interested in taking advantage of its tax benefits while providing an opportunity for families in need to receive an ICGS education
- Conducted the 2019 2020 Annual Appeal to raise funds for the enhancement of the ICGS educational environment. A report on the success of this effort will be distributed in the fall.
- Managed and concluded the ICGS
 Queen of Hearts Jackpot to raise
 funds and awareness for the ICGS
 Education Endowment Fund, which
 met its goal of \$1,000,000 earlier this
 year. Unfortunately, the unanticipated
 pandemic and global market fluctuations
 impacted the Endowment, which later
 fell below the goal and will continue to
 be a focus of the board. Once the goal
 is reestablished, the interest income can



be used to offset inflationary increases, to retain quality teachers, and to provide tuition assistance to families in crisis.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all my fellow school board members for their dedication and willingness to share their talents, time, and passion for the benefit of our school. I would like to highlight our retiring members. Having served their 3 year terms, Amy Brandt and Robert Moore have positively impacted our initiatives and duties in countless ways, especially in developing our After-Care Program, managing our Queen of Hearts Jackpot, and serving on our Finance Committee. I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to Tom Dewbray, Past-President and retiring board member. His personal mentorship throughout the year, successful promotion of "Empower Illinois," ongoing leadership, and continued passion for board initiatives are truly appreciated.

The ICGS Parents' Club – comprised of ALL of our parents – came together to yield tremendous results this year. We provided truly impressive financial support to the school and created many programs to enhance our children's educational experiences. During these unprecedented times due to COVID-19, our community came together

even stronger and supported our school, teachers, and each other in creative ways.

Through our fundraising efforts throughout the year, we raised more than \$277,000! We contributed \$115,000 to cover ICGS operating expenses which helps keep tuition lower. We donated \$65,000 for teacher bonuses (which includes generous donations to the Teacher Appreciation Fund); \$20,000 to the Annual Appeal; almost \$20,000 for tuition assistance, and \$10,000 for the Endowment Fund.

Our Parents' Club dedicated many hours and funds to a wide range of activities for the children including the Halloween Hoedown, school play, classroom activities, fine arts, dance class, Destination Imagination, year-round Teacher Appreciation programs, Cardio Club, enrichment programs, and much more! Parents also led several programs for our families: a mentoring program for new families, the Back to School Ice Cream Social, school supplies program, IC Scrip, prayer group, spirit wear, uniform exchange, website support, and more.

COVID-19 created new challenges for our community. Our parents organized birthday car parades for classmates, created masks for essential workers, videos, virtual graduations, made special deliveries to students, and much more! While our 8th graders didn't experience the traditional, very special

graduation events our Parents' Club usually hosts, our administration and teachers provided a proper virtual send-off-delivered right to their homes! One thing is true, our 8th graders developed new strengths: the ability to overcome adversity, resilience, and patience. God bless them as they enter high school and continue to make us proud.

I am honored to be a part of a very special organization, and proud of our accomplishments.



Academic Kighlights

At Immaculate Conception Grade School we have a reputation for setting high academic standards from the earliest stages.

We place a heavy emphasis on developing self-discipline, time management, and practice skills so that our students are well-prepared for high school. Year after year, high school administrators reach out to express their appreciation for how well prepared they find our graduates. We realize however, that not every student is the same. For that reason, we provide different levels of instruction within our grades, along with the aid of Reading and Math Specialists. With these resources, we can meet the needs of all our students. whether they need additional help or to be challenged. Our curriculum is aligned with the learning standards of both the Diocese of Joliet and the State of Illinois. Additionally, we have been accredited by AdvancED, the world's largest school accrediting agency.



E-Learning Highlights

On March 14th, it was announced that Immaculate Conception Grade School would be closed due to the COVID-19 global pandemic.

In preparation for E-learning, the ICGS administration sent students home with textbooks, workbooks and, if necessary, Chromebook computers. In the weeks leading up to the school's closing, administrators and faculty members began making preparations to pivot to e-learning. Resources were explored and shared among teachers on a daily basis. On Tuesday, March 17, students officially transitioned to this new format of learning from home. We could not be prouder of how well our entire school community adjusted to this massive change. Because at ICGS we place a heavy emphasis on independent study and work, time management, and homework reinforcement, this transition went more smoothly than we could have hoped.

Upon returning from Thanksgiving break, she was called down to Mrs. Linley's

office. The principal told her that the classroom presentations had made an incredible impact. The parents of a 3rd grade student had notified the principal that, when their daughter came home with Olivia's handout, they decided to take her into the doctor because she was experiencing the symptoms listed on the handout. She was quickly diagnosed with Type I Diabetes. Olivia's reaction?




